

Marriage/Civil Union Licenses

- A marriage or civil union license may be obtained at any Town or City Clerks' office regardless of your New Hampshire residence.
- Both parties must be present at the time of application.
- Blood tests are not required.
- Marriage or civil union ceremony may take place anywhere in New Hampshire.
- The fee for a marriage or civil union license is \$45.00.
- The marriage or civil union license will be prepared at application time.
- Applicants should come to the Town Clerk's office a minimum of 1 hour prior to closing time.
- The license is good for 90 days from the date of application.
- The following documentation must be presented at the time of application:
 - Valid Photo Identification
 - Proof of age. (i.e. driver's license or birth certificate)
 - A certified copy of the death certificate if prior spouse or partner is deceased.
 - A certified copy of the final divorce decree, annulment or dissolution
- Be prepared to answer the following questions:
 - Parents birthplace-State or Country
 - Mother's maiden name
 - Race (i.e. White, Black, American Indian, etc.)
 - Ancestry (i.e. English, French, Irish, Puerto Rican, etc.)
 - If known, the name and address of your Officiant (person performing your ceremony)
- After record of ceremony is filed, you may obtain Certified Copies of your marriage or civil union certificate. They are \$12.00 for the first copy and \$8.00 for each subsequent copy issued at the same time as the initial copy.
